## "Engaging Diversity through Ignatian Eyes" Retreat

Clarence Heller who organized the Month of Guided Prayer in which Christ Lutheran participated two years ago, is organizing a retreat July 14-15. The title of this year's retreat is "For Christ Plays in Ten Thousand Places: Engaging Diversity through Ignatian Eyes." The retreat director, Christopher Pramuk, will guide retreatants in a sustained meditation on the discipline, the vulnerability, and the Gospel-infused joy of engaging with others receptively, contem-

platively, and toward the building together of what Pope Francis has called a "culture of encounter." For the sake of love, God invites us to examine honestly and fearlessly the many ways we alienate ourselves from one another, and thus from the hidden Christ who plays in all things.

The retreat will be held at the CSJ Provincial House (6400 Minnesota, St. Louis, MO 63111) Friday, July 14 from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm and on Saturday, July 15 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm (lunch included). Christopher Pramuk is associate professor of theology at Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is the author of "Sophia: The Hidden Christ of Thomas Merton" and "Hope Sings, So Beautiful: Graced Encounters across the Color Line." The recipient of the Catholic Theological Society of America's 2009 Catherine Mowry LaCugna Award, he has also received the International Thomas Merton Society's 2011 Thomas Merton Award, and several best essay awards from the Catholic Press Association. A lifelong musician and student of African American spirituality, he has led numerous workshops on the healing of race relations in society and the church, as well as retreats on the life and writings of Thomas Merton.

# Pastor's Word

## *“Silence and Spiders and Things Beyond”*

Thirty-five junior high youth sat silently for five minutes. That, in itself, is quite a miracle. Also miraculous was what we heard and saw during that time: The calling to their mates of at least five kinds of birds, the soft chirping of a baby bird in a nearby nest, the magical lights of fireflies and a sky full of stars. All of these miracles might have gone unnoticed if the group had been talking or focused on themselves. Instead, for five minutes last Tuesday during evening worship at Confircamp we were instructed to be listeners and observers of things beyond ourselves.

We tend to fill our ears with music, newscasts and phone calls and our eyes with the images on screens and papers. As someone busy gathering information and often too focused on my own concerns, I found that a few days at a camp, away from my usual routine, was a powerful reminder that there is a world outside myself. Not only is nature waiting to be seen and heard but I felt God was waiting to be rediscovered as well.

On a quiet, early morning walk I noticed a spider web shimmering in the sunlight and blowing in the soft breeze. It was perfectly constructed and its weaver was perfectly centered in the middle waiting to catch breakfast. It was both a source of life, for the spider, and a source

of death, for the unfortunate insect soon to be trapped, but it was also unnecessarily beautiful. The unnecessary beauty of nature convinces me that nature was created by a power, God, who delights in delighting us. My few days at Confircamp helped me put my life in perspective. Compared to the world outside me, my plans and problems are small. Compared to the beauty of God seen in nature and the love of God shown in Scripture, my heart is small. And yet my small heart is loved unconditionally by God.

May each of you find ways this summer to put your lives in perspective and feel the immense joy of God's love.

The theme is “What Would Katie Do?” referring to Katie Luther and is based on Romans 12:2. ## JUNE Council Highlights

At its June meeting the Christ Lutheran Church Council:

--Discussed chapter 4 of Crucial Conversations. This chapter highlighted the carefulness required when looking at "content" of conversation in the light of the "conditions" of a conversation.

--Treasurer Larry Hill reported income at the end of May at \$185,890 versus expenses at \$176,407 and a prorated budget at \$186,083. He noted offerings in May were down 13% compared to recent years.

--Christian Service reminded the council of the current collection for Joni and Friends and the availability of social justice yard signs which are for sale. The next month's "green envelope" offering is for the Lambert Airport Interfaith Chapel.

--Fellowship reported on the recent Pool Party at the McCartys' and reminded of the preparations for hosting the July 4 events.

--Inreach reported on the celebrations and gifts for high school graduates and moms on Mother's Day, as well as the monthly birthday and anniversary celebration, and the greeting card ministry. A reminder was given to update the online directory by getting information to Katie Ciorba. There is an app to make use of this directory. Inreach will be working with Send Me St. Louis which leads congregations into ways to work deeply and with sensitivity to surrounding communities. This is with leadership from Matt Mueller and Lutheran Family and Social Services.

--Outreach will be meeting soon for future planning. They will be working with the July 4 endeavor as well as the 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

--Property has taken a survey of the church grounds and buildings for repairs and needs. At the church they looked at roof leaks, leaking boiler expansion tanks, tuckpointing, landscaping, AC units, and working with the renovation team. At the Mead Center they noted refinishing and repairing the front doors, broken stained glass and plastic protectors, gutters and leaks, front step cracks, overgrown trees, and signage for renting groups.

--Renovation reported that Powers Bowersox Associates has been chosen as the architectural firm to work with.

--The pastors briefly reviewed the recent synod assembly, updated on some member health issues, and the office administration in light of the health issues of Susan Hunt.

The business of the meeting received the proposed draft of the Reconciling in Christ team and approved it as amended it for further process in the congregation.

A report was heard from the 120<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee and proposed Sept. 30 as the main day of celebration of the anniversary with activities for all ages, especially children. A suggestion to incorporate the Reformation 500 Time Capsule distributed at the synod assembly into the 120<sup>th</sup> Anniversary activities was accepted.

The request for transfer for Charlie Willie to St. Mark Evangelical Lutheran in Davenport, IA was honored.

The council is scheduled to meet next on July 18.
