A meeting has been scheduled with Council, the Call Committee and Rev. Arnold for August 14. Please keep the work of the Call Committee in your prayers as they discern God's leading over these next months.

As you can see, growth is occurring among us. It should also be said that the number of babies being baptized is also a wonderful sign that is obvious to all. What may not be as obvious is that there have been several visitors among us who are seriously interested in making Christ Lutheran their home. News from Central States Synod

Four representatives from the Central States Synod will leave on August 27 for a 17-day itinerary of consultations and meetings with The Evangelical Lutheran Church--Papua New Guinea (PNG). Rev. Keith Holste of St. Louis will be representing the Eastern Missouri Conference Ministry. Rev. Gary Teske of Topeka, KS, Rev. Amy Truhe of Lindsborg, KS, and Emily Greble of Independence, MO will also represent the Central States Synod. The four-member synod team will spend the majority of its time with the Central States Synod Companion Synod in the Kotte District, on the east end of the island.

They will join representatives from ELCA synods in Michigan, Virginia, and North Carolina, as well as from the ELCA church-wide office at the PNG church's national headquarters in Lae for a three-day consultation on how best to be partners in mission with one another. Ongoing programs, such as the camp counselor exchange, will be considered, as well as new ways to interact.

The companion synod mission partner itinerary is underwritten by the Central States Synod, but additional donations are being sought to close the gap on what is available and what is needed. It was when he had trouble in gym class then, that he was diagnosed with cerebral palsy and could begin to deal with his physical limitations. He also had his best class that year. It was Civics class which inspired him to stay involved in current affairs. When in conversation with John, you'll find that he is very motivated to stay up-to-date on world happenings.

John majored in theology as an undergrad at St. Louis University. It was there that he learned a valuable line from Johann Wolfgang von Goethe that he is fond of quoting: "Those who know nothing of foreign languages know nothing of their own."

Since he joined Christ Lutheran nearly 20 years ago, he says that he greatly values the worship here. That is why he is so happy to participate whenever and wherever he can, serving as he does as Assisting Minister, or acolyte. John arrives very early on Sunday mornings so he can attend to any additional needs that arise in order to help prepare for worship. John also leads the text study that meets with area clergy on Tuesday mornings in the church conference room. An avid advocate for disabilities awareness, John is involved wherever possible to further understanding of disabilities issues.
