October 2019 Call committee began interviewing Pastor Meagan McLaughlin

Nov 2-4, 2019 Pastor Meagan and her wife Karen visited Christ Lutheran and the Call Committee over a three-

day weekend.

Nov 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019 The Call Committee recommended Pastor Meagan to the Council, who voted unanimously to

affirm and recommend her to the congregation.

#### Who is Pastor Meagan?



Meagan studied at St. Olaf College (English major), Luther Seminary, and obtained her Master of Divinity from United Theological Seminary. She currently lives in Minneapolis and has been under assignment in that synod for five years ministering to several congregations, most recently Bethel Lutheran Church in Little Falls. She just completed her assignment there as a Synodically Authorized Minister. Previous to Bethel, she was a pastoral assistant at Holy Trinity and Vicar Intern at Mount Olive. Before this, she was a Christian Life Assistant at the Basilica of Saint Mary in Minneapolis for 9 years. Before her work in ministry, she was an instructional designer, technical writer, and a teacher. Although she is a First Call candidate, she has lots of experience in pastoral care, preaching, worship planning, youth programming (including leading confirmation), church administration, and community work.

The Call Committee has spent considerable time with Meagan—interviewing her, sharing meals, touring the church and community, and attending Chapel at Eden Seminary. We have had extensive conversations with her bishop, mentors and colleagues, and current members of her congregation. Meagan is relatable, approachable, qualified, and experienced. With her warm, calming, and collaborative leadership style, the call committee believes she is an excellent fit for Christ Lutheran and our greater community.

We appreciate the congregation's understanding of the confidential nature of the call process to this point. Now that we have a candidate, it's time for everyone to get to know her. You can start by reading her sermons, which can be accessed here:

<u>Friday December 6<sup>th</sup>: Praise and Pizza in Fellowship Hall from 5:30 to 7:00.</u> Everyone is welcome. This is a great event for families and will be informal. Jesse Helton will lead us in singing and then the Sunday School children will help us all get to know Pastor Meagan a little better with a Q&A session. Food and drink will be provided.

<u>Saturday December 7<sup>th</sup>:</u> Pastor Meagan and Karen will attend the **Advent Brunch** at 10:00am Pastor Meagan will meet with Council, staff, and the Worship team in the Fellowship Hall from 3:30 to 5:00 pm for afternoon **Cookies and Tea**.

<u>Sunday December 8<sup>th</sup>:</u> Pastor Meagan will be introduced to both **8:00 and 10:30 services** and lead a prayer. She will stop by **Sunday School** to say hello to kids and parents for 15 minutes between services. She will be available between services (there is no adult forum) and after the 10:30 service in the fellowship hall for a **Meet and Greet** with the congregation.

Monday December 9<sup>th</sup>: Pastor Meagan will be in the fellowship hall from 6:30-8:00 pm for **Dessert and Tea** for any member who was not able to meet her during the weekend.

**December 10<sup>th</sup> through the 14<sup>th</sup>**, the Call Committee will host several listening sessions during the day and in the evening at church. This will be a time to come ask additional questions and share your reaction to the previous weekend's festivities. We will alert the congregation to specific times and dates in an upcoming email.

#### Treasurer's Report – Financial Results Through September 2019

Treasurer's Report for the 9 Months through September 2019

So far this year contributions to Christ Lutheran for general operating purposes are less than what was received over the same period last year by 16% (\$49,000). Our budget for this year conservatively reflected an expectation of some decline in contributions, but even with that the total of contributions through the year's first 9 months is trailing what had been anticipated by \$27,000. Please consider doing whatever you are able to help make up our revenue shortfall, particularly as we see higher impending costs both to maintain and repair our properties and to successfully complete the next phases of our pastoral call process. As always, we are most grateful for your generous giving to Christ Lutheran. Thank you!



#### Presiding bishop statement on Israeli civilian settlements

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is very disturbed by the November 18 announcement by Secretary of State Michael R. Pompeo that the Administration unwisely is changing current U.S. policy by stating that the "establishment of Israeli civilian settlements in the West Bank is not per se inconsistent with international law." Our church has consistently called for an end to the Israeli occupation of the Palestinian territory, the cessation of all settlement activities and withdrawal from settlements on Palestinian territory to the 1967 boundaries, a negotiated, final status agreement between Israel and the Palestinians and the establishment of and international support for a viable, contiguous Palestinian state. We will continue to work with ecumenical and inter-religious partners who share these commitments. In the long term, we wish to see Israelis and Palestinians co-existing in justice and peace, as citizens of viable and secure Israeli and Palestinian states.

The Administration's announcement makes the realization of these outcomes to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict more difficult and distant, rather than advancing the cause of peace. The announcement, like earlier ones on the conflict, gives no evidence of having been developed in consultation with those who will be most adversely affected by this policy, namely the

Palestinians in the occupied territory. Instead, it will give a "green light" to further settlement activity and a worsening of the conditions of occupation, including intensified military and police measures and the further diversion of natural and other resources that benefit only settlers.

By reverting to the policy of the Reagan Administration, the new policy ignores facts that have been created on the ground since 1989 (from a settler population then of close to 200,000 to an estimated more than 700,000 at present in the West Bank and East Jerusalem). It also discredits international law such as various provisions of the Fourth Geneva Convention -- to which Israel is a party -- about the obligations of an occupying power as well as the prevailing international consensus about settlements, most recently articulated in Security Council resolution 2334 of 2016 (to which all UN member states are bound according to the UN Charter).

Our distress with this announcement is primarily its impact on the daily life of Palestinians, especially our sisters and brothers in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, but also their Christian and Muslim neighbors. We are also concerned with policy changes that further distance the United States from the prevailing international consensus on the path toward a negotiated solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, including respecting human rights standards and international law.
