#### Stand Your Ground by Kelly Brown Douglas

A mother with a teenage son, Kelly Brown Douglas feels the shooting of 17-year-old Trayvon Martin as an immediate family danger, an all-too-familiar story in the black community. In <u>Stand Your Ground</u>, the theologian and Episcopal priest traces white exceptionalism in American history from the Massachusetts Bay Company to Manifest Destiny to the Stand Your Ground laws in Florida that protected the "watch captain" who shot Trayvon from criminal charges.

Dear Family of Faith,

The Covid-19 Team met August 26th, we focused on two things. First, we reviewed the results of the survey we put out recently, and we want to thank all who filled that out for taking the time to do so! Your responses and ideas were so helpful to us, and will be helpful to the Council members and Committees as we move into fall. More information on what we learned will come to you from Council soon, but there are a couple of things I will share with you now.

One thing that was very clear in the responses to the survey is that by far the majority of the congregation will not plan to return to in-person indoor Worship at this time, as case numbers remain high. At this time, given those responses and the information we have about the virus, our primary way of Worshipping together will be online for the time being. Please know that we on the Covid Team remain committed to planning for our full return to in-person gathering.

The other thing that was very clear in the survey results was just how deeply we are all missing being together in person, and wish for the normalcy of not needing to consider the virus in our decisions. And, we hear the challenges of Zoom and other online ways of connecting, and know the school year is only adding to that. We recognize the very real need to begin to meet in person, as we can safely.

In light of all of that, you will see a variety of opportunities, starting with the collection we held for Webster-Rock Hill Ministries in the parking lot, for us to gather outside while weather allows. Although full Worship will remain online for now, music and prayer time will certainly be among them! There is room for creativity here—several great ideas were shared in the survey comments, and all of the committees, and indeed individual members, are invited to share any additional ideas you have. Details on how we can do these events safely are attached to the church email sent Monday Aug. 31st.

I will also be doing "porch visits" with a few of our members who are not able to connect to Worship on Zoom next week, and would truly welcome the chance to meet outside with any of you, so, please reach out!

Thank you all for hanging in with us. I am so grateful for your commitment, and flexibility, and energy and passion, that have enabled us to continue being church together, and indeed are helping to discover in new ways what that means.

Please come to me or any member of the Covid Team with any joys, concerns, frustrations, and questions you have. We want to be in conversation with you, and we are attending to all of the ideas and thoughts you shared in the survey.
