


PASTOR'S WORD



"Are we there, yet?" We are clearly entering into summer this week, as more schools finish for the year, summer activities (adapted and truncated though they may be) begin, and the famed St. Louis heat that we have been warned about has started to build. Meanwhile, our journey with Covid-19 continues, loneliness growing ever heavier, our economic challenges are daunting and so many are struggling with the impact of the pandemic on their businesses and employment, the reality of racism daunting. What we all hoped would be a short hiatus from gathering in-person is now showing itself to be a longer-term shift in how we live our lives. "Are we there *yet*??"

Jesus sent the disciples on a journey, and as he did, he seems to have known it wouldn't be easy. He tells them they will be like "sheep among wolves," facing challenging times and barriers along the way. He talks of needing to be ready to face demons. He prepared them to be turned away, at times. They will see illness, and poverty, and death. And as they travel, they are to *bring the good news*.

As we walk the journey, this is our task, too: bring healing, and life, and most of all, proclaim the good news: God is with us, even in those moments that have us wishing this trip was over, already! God's peace, God's shalom in the midst of the trials of this world, will always come back to us, surrounding us and strengthening us so we can take the next step. Reminding us of why we are on this road, in the first place.

"*Are we there yet?*" No, we are not there yet. But we are walking the road together, and God is with us, and that is indeed good news.





A note from Bishop Susan Candea and the Synod Council of the Central States: The recent murders of Ahmaud Arbrey, Breonna Taylor, Dreasjon (Sean) Reed, and George Floyd have jolted many to action. For more than a week, individuals around the world have taken to the streets to express their pain, anger, and frustration over the dehumanization being experienced by black and brown people due to individual/ systemic racism. The anguish endured by people of color in this country because of the actions or inactions of other citizens is real, and it cannot be ignored. Racism and racist notions have no place in Christianity. They are antithetical to our core beliefs. We believe God made all of humanity in God's image (Gen. 1:27). We believe Jesus Christ lives in each one of us (1 John 4:13) and tears down the dividing wall of hostility between us (Eph. 2:14). And we believe we are all members of the Body of Christ; hence, "if one member suffers, we all suffer with it" (1 Cor. 12:26). Despite our relationship with God, we are sinners. We consciously and unconsciously sin against God and each other in thought, word, and deed. We love neither God nor our neighbor with our whole heart. Instead, we give in to temptation and seek to satisfy our own desires. The Synod Council of the Central States encourages its congregations and their members to use this time of national self-examination as an opportunity to engage in courageous dialogue to tackle the sinful issue of racism. We invite our faith communities to listen to the experiences and perspectives of those who have endured racism and aggression at the hands of individuals and institutions, including our own ELCA. We also ask members to reflect on what actions they have taken or missed to reduce racism and lift up the dignity of all people. The Council understands that discussions about race are difficult. Some participants may feel uncomfortable and even vulnerable. But what is hard should not stop us from doing what is right. The Synod has tools available (https://www.css-elca.org/ workshops) to facilitate positive, courageous dialogue. Therefore, we encourage congregations and members to be brave and examine their own attitudes and conduct. Each person, regardless of background or age, can help to advance the eradication of racism, disrupt systemic inequality and inequity, build a more inclusive community, and live out Christ's teaching to love our neighbor.

They were doing what we are called to as they engaged in bible study. It was Wednesday night— a stranger walked in to Mother Emmanuel AME Church, and the people welcomed him and prayed together.

This stranger, a man baptized, formed, communed, and Confirmed in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, wanted to ignite a "race war," he said, after he shot and killed them, denying them the very humanity he claimed for himself, claiming rights and privileges associated with "whiteness."

Today, we mourn their deaths, and the deaths of all black and brown people who have died since at the hands of those who didn't see their humanity. We acknowledge our failure as people of God to stand up against the lies and destruction and death of racism and white supremacy. We ask for God's healing. We commit ourselves to do the work necessary to end this evil.

Let's Talk About Race . . .

Our Synod, Central States, has invited clergy to do some reading, conversation, and reflection on race and racism. As the fires continue to burn in several parts of our country, it is a call to all of us to do this work, and learn how we can better understand how racism has impacted all of us, and what we can do to make a difference.
