I read somewhere once that, no matter what a person had, once their basic needs were met, they all felt they would be happier—content—with just 10% more. From the millionaire with three mansions, to the person living in a home just big enough for their family, this was the pattern. "If I just had 10% more, it would truly be enough." Anyone else get into this way of thinking? It is so easy to slip into, and we are immersed in a culture that seems to constantly tell us that we need just one more thing. Just a little bit more. Reading the Exodus story for this Sunday, about the manna in the desert, brought this to mind, and reminded me of how different God's perspective is on this. The Israelites were frustrated, feeling like they might actually have been better off in Egypt, and God shows them a different way. Every evening, meat. Every morning, manna for the day. Not enough to store, but enough to eat for the day, for all of them. It got me thinking. Where have I seen God providing for me, giving me what I need, for today? One of my kitties helped me wake up, snuggling me and letting me know it was time. My wife made me stir fry for dinner, one of my favorites. A college friend sent a long e-mail, reconnecting about life and ministry. The famous St. Louis humidity dropped, allowing us to spend a long time sitting outdoors. Not enough to store, perhaps, but plenty of joy and connection and nourishment for the day. Where have you seen God providing for you, today?

Friday evening, I spent half an hour standing vigil on Lockwood, along with members and clergy from Peace UCC, Emmanuel Episcopal, and several other communities of faith along Lockwood in Webster, all of us claiming that racism and white supremacy in our communities cannot continue. A mother with a teenage son, Kelly Brown Douglas feels the shooting of 17-year-old Trayvon Martin as an immediate family danger, an all-too-familiar story in the black community. In <u>Stand Your Ground</u>, the theologian and Episcopal priest traces white exceptionalism in American history from the Massachusetts Bay Company to Manifest Destiny to the Stand Your Ground laws in Florida that protected the "watch captain" who shot Trayvon from criminal charges.
