PASTOR'S WORD



Family of faith, as you may be aware, this past week white supremacist symbols were spray painted on several sidewalks and doors around churches in our neighborhood, showing us that the evil of racism is present in our community. As Moses was called and empowered to walk toward the pain of God's beloved, as Ezekiel proclaimed God's desire that all should be beloved and redeemed, as Jesus taught his disciples that faithful relationships of love and justice and mercy require commitment and action, so we as people of faith are also called and empowered and sent to embody God's love and justice everywhere we go. Edmund Burke said, "All it takes for evil to triumph is for good people to do nothing." Let us not be inactive and silent, but follow Jesus' lead and embody God's love and justice in our community of Webster and beyond.

I invite all of us to consider actions that we can take in the next month to learn about and begin to dismantle racism in our communities. Here are four possibilities, among the many options:

- 1. **Read "Dear Church"** by ELCA pastor Lenny Duncan. It is a heartfelt personal sharing by a pastor who is a person of color in our church. If you would like to talk with other Christ Lutheran members about the book, please let me know.
- 2. **Have a courageous conversation** with a friend or family member about racism and white privilege. Challenge a biased or discriminatory statement or joke when you hear it. Ask a person of color with whom you are in relationship what their experience has been—and simply listen to their story.
- 3. **Vote!** We are called by our faith to be engaged in our community, to seek the well-being of the city, as it says in Jeremiah. So, please make your plan to vote, and bring your faith with you to the poles. MO Faith Voices is doing incredible work to ensure that voting is safe and accessible as possible for especially those who are marginalized, and they report that many especially in the north part of St. Louis experienced difficulties in accessing voting this spring. - 4. Follow faith-led community racial justice organization Expect Us on social media, or keep up on their website to know the work they are doing and choose to participate if you can.

Stand Your Ground by Kelly Brown Douglas

A mother with a teenage son, Kelly Brown Douglas feels the shooting of 17-year-old Trayvon Martin as an immediate family danger, an all-too-familiar story in the black community. In <u>Stand Your Ground</u>, the theologian and Episcopal priest traces white exceptionalism in American history from the Massachusetts Bay Company to Manifest Destiny to the Stand Your Ground laws in Florida that protected the "watch captain" who shot Trayvon from criminal charges.




