


# ONE IN CHRIST

#### **Pastors Word**



It seemed like such contrast to the divisiveness and negativity that surrounds the election process, especially when there are contentious issues on the ballot. In Kansas, we were voting on a constitutional amendment that would allow the legislature to put a ban on abortion. It did not pass to the relief of some and the disappointment of others.

That experience at the polling place made me realize that exercising our rights and responsibilities as citizens is something to **celebrate** for it is one of the ways in which we honor and use the gift that God has given us. The ELCA Social Message on <u>Government and Civic Engagement in the United States: Discipleship in a Democracy</u>, reminds us that,

". . . government remains God's gift because it is intended to do what churches, families, individuals and businesses cannot do on their own: protect and coordinate the well-being of individuals, communities, and creation. Some people object to the church involving itself in matters related to government, in 'politics.' Taking partisan stances is not the church's role but 'politics' has to do with negotiating how the benefits and burdens of living in a society are shared."

Through the gospels we hear invitations for people to not just be thankful for but to **celebrate** God's gifts. Think about the stories of finding the lost sheep and the lost coin. When we participate in the government process we are *protecting and coordinating the well beings of individuals, communities, and creation.* That is something to **celebrate** as the people of God. That doesn't mean we will all agree or vote the same on every issue or candidate. But we can be examples of civic engagement that acts out of love for neighbor and trusts in God. Again, that is something to **celebrate!**
