### Deuteronomy 30:15-20

[Moses said to the people:] 15See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. 16If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. 17But if your heart turns away and you do not hear, but are led astray to bow down to other gods and serve them, 18I declare to you today that you shall perish; you shall not live long in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to enter and possess. 19I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live, 20loving the Lord your God, obeying him, and holding fast to him; for that means life to you and length of days, so that you may live in the land that the Lord swore to give to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.



### **Bible Study**


The Tuesday Morning Bible Study will meet each Tuesday morning at 10:30am, in the fellowship hall. All are welcomed to join us!

### PAPUA NEW GUINEA SUNDAY

February 12, 2023



The visitation team from the Central States Synod gathered with the District Council of the Kote District during discussions about where, when, and how we can be partners in ministry

The partnership between the Central States Synod and the Kote District of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Papua New Guinea remains strong in spite of being tested by the pandemic during the past years. Due to the pandemic there have been no visitations either to or from Papua New Guinea since late 2019 when a team from the synod participated in a consultation in Papua New Guinea together with representatives from the other three synods who have companion ties to PNG. However, we have continued to communicate and now that the Covid pandemic is easing, there are plans for a visitation to Papua New Guinea in 2024. Let me share with you the most recent communication from the president of the Kote District. Greetings to all of our friends in the USA. God be with you all. We are currently fighting a plan by a gold mining company

called Wapi/Golpu to build a pipeline that will dump mine waste in the waters of the huon gulf. Our district has joined with the national church in objecting to this plan as it would threaten the waters that are a primary source of food for a great many of our people. We appreciate the money

collected by your synod to help us purchase new Sunday School materials. Our circuits are now working to raise our portion of the funds so that the materials can be printed. The covid pandemic is easing and while some of the cities and towns still have problems, we in the Kote District are doing well. Thank you for thinking of us and for your prayers. The big earthquake last September did affect our district. There were no deaths but some houses and buildings were destroyed or damaged. Our district hosted the national women's conference last September and in September, 2023 we will host the national youth conference. We send to you, all our friends, Christmas and New Year's greetings. God has given us the best present, Jesus Christ. So now we together can spread the love of God during the Christmas season and the

### Pillars of Community: A Celebration of Local Black History

Join Alliance for Interracial Dignity on February 26, 2023, for a multifaceted Black History Month event focusing on local Black history.
