#### **PASTOR'S NOTE**



#### Isaiah 42: 5-7

<sup>5</sup>Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: <sup>6</sup>I am the LORD, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, <sup>7</sup>to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

#### Matthew 3:13-17

<sup>13</sup>Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. <sup>14</sup>John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" <sup>15</sup>But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. <sup>16</sup>And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. <sup>17</sup>And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

Where do you feel God's breath and spirit in your life?
What does Isaiah mean when he says God has given us as a covenant to the people?
How does this connect to our baptismal promises?


## Stewardship & Offerings

## In Loving Memory of Robert Brockelmeyer


The funeral for Bob Brockelmeyer will take place this coming Thursday, January 12, at 10:30am.

Sunday, January 8. In Pastor Roger Ruff words, he offered, "a Flyover of the Gospel of Matthew." Matthew's Gospel, the longest of the four canonical Gospels, is the source of the Gospel readings for the liturgical year that began after Thanksgiving. Written around 80-90 CE, or fifty to sixty years after the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus, the Gospel is written from a the point of view of the Jews of the period.

It begins with a genealogy of Jesus, tracing his linage back to Abraham. The Gospel repeatedly quotes Hebrew Scriptures to show how events in Jesus' life and his actions fulfill prophecies from the past. And throughout it shows Jesus credentials as the true Messiah and as the supreme teacher and interpreter of Mosaic Law.

Major themes are: the abiding presence of God; Jesus as the Son of God; Jewish Law and Christian Faith; people of little faith; and a critique of Power. Although it is written for an audience familiar with Jewish teaching of the time, it ends with the Great Commission, Matthew 28: 19-20.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

Pastor Ruff said that in the end study of Matthew's Gospel enriches and nurtures personal faith. Or, in the words of an old Christian prayer, "Read, Mark and inwardly Digest" it.

**Inreach:** Responsible for ensuring a fulfilling experience at Christ Lutheran for current members, during and outside of the service. This involves making sure people have access to the service and soliciting ideas for possible improvement. Inreach also provides support to other committees, especially the Fellowship and Worship committees, as there is a fair amount of overlap between them. During COVID, Inreach has helped coordinate all the technology for the Zoom church services. Other jobs include planning the 4th of July festivities, welcome and birthday parties.
