
Stewardship & Offerings

"Caring for God's Creation." We will also be breaking kids up into smaller groups by ages for part of the Sunday School hour as well.


TECH TEAM VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Bible Study

The Tuesday morning Bible Study group meets at 10:30 in the Parish Hall. The group has recently enjoyed reading and discussing many of the minor prophets in the Hebrew Bible, and they expect to continue that in the Fall.





Adult forum will meet at 9:00 during the educational hour but still in the Fellowship Hall with the coffeepot nearby. **November 13 Jon Heerboth**— Jon says: I plan to have a presentation and discussion of legends surrounding the travels of Jesus to England, to India, and to where he eventually died in Japan. We can cover what little there is in the gospels and then move to these three stories. We may even get to "meet" Jesus'

descendent and visit his grave.

November 20 Carlos Suarez of the International Institute will give a brief overview of the work to welcome and resettle refugees in the Saint Louis area. He will also describe the current climate for refugees and tell how we can get involved.

November 27 Intergenerational Experience—packing lunches for Gateway 180 shelter.

On Sunday November 6 Alena Horn showed how Christian Anarchism, unlike political anarchism is not a recipe for chaos. Rather it draws on the sermon on the mount as found in Matthew 5 to espouse a way of life that follow's Jesus example calling Christians to a life of service and pacifism. Two prominent Christian Anarchists were Leo Tolstoy, the Russian Novelist and Dorothy Day, a mid -20th century writer and activist. The movement is relevant to us today because it reminds us to put Christ above culture, to turn towards the Gospel and away from the automatic reflexes of the right-left divide.

Packing Tips

40# Maximum Weight/Box – Please! If heavier than this, it is hard for some of our volunteer crew to handle.

Please use sturdy boxes. NOTE: It has been reported that boxes from the pet supply company, *Chewy*, were less than ideal as they have no structural support and collapse when stacked.

Please fill boxes completely. Boxes with space are easily crushed when stacked.

Pack each type of gift in separate boxes.

Do not pack any quilts or kits in plastic bags.

Use packing tape (no masking tape) to securely close boxes.

Use wide black markers to label each box clearly on at least two sides with "LWR" and the quantity and type of gift

Please contact Gloria Sharp before October 29 or Eunice Halverson before November 5 to report approximately how many boxes will be delivered (contact information above)

Complete the Inventory Sheet; keep one copy for your records and deliver one copy with your boxes.

The Inventory Sheet for St. Louis and Mid-MO Areas is on the Ingathering Map: Ingathering (lwr.org)

While we will have strong volunteers at the Ingathering Site at Shepherd of the Hills Church, it would be very helpful to bring individuals who can help unload your boxes into the semi.

Access to Shepherd of the Hills Church will be available for bathroom use; masks required before entering.
