Don't panic, it is still November, there are still 41 days until Christmas, and 47 days until we need to break out the new calendars for 2023. But as we celebrate Christ the King Sunday this Sunday, we as Christians are turning the page to a new church year. We have spent the last year hearing from the Gospel of Luke about the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. And now we will hear from Matthew as we enter Advent, a season of reflection on where it all began, in a stable in Bethlehem some 2,000 years ago. When God came to earth in Jesus, a tiny, vulnerable, human baby. One of us. And yet so much more than that.





The Unknown Years of Jesus: Legends from the Road was the title Jon Heerboth chose for his talk November 13. Over the years stories exploit the long gaps in Jesus' life to create legends that portray Jesus traveling to places far away from Palestine. One says Jesus accompanyed his "uncle" Joseph of Arimathea to tin mines in England during his teen years. Another has Jesus meditating at a Buddhist Monastery in Ladaka Tibet in his twenties—backed up by documents at the site. And still another in Japan holds that Jesus ended up there, ministering to the poor, after his brother took his place at the crucifixion. Two graves at a remote town in northern Japan, one said to be of Jesus and the other containing relics of his brother, are the site of an annual festival. Jon believes that the last two legends originated from encounters with Christians.

The important message, Jon said, is the Idea of Jesus is so appealing that people imagine stories of Jesus that fit him into their lives. Those inside the Christian tradition and outside of it use legends to understand their faith.
