Pastor's Word



Luke 18:9-14

⁹He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: ¹⁰"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹²I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' ¹³But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' ¹⁴I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

"In this week's Gospel reading, Jesus doesn't shy away from the big, bad "S" word. He insists on it. He insists on the practice of acknowledging and naming our core sinfulness. He insists on the healing, cleansing, justifying power of honest confession.

"Why? Because honest confession relieves a burdensome secret. It tells the truth, which is that I am a beautiful mess — made in God's divine image, but mired in a human brokenness that wars against its own salvation. To use the word "sinner" in my prayer life is to insist on something more profound and more clarifying than, "I make mistakes," or "I've got issues." To use the word *sinner* is to refuse the arrogant us/them divide of the Pharisee, and instead acknowledge that I, too, am utterly lost and bereft, but for the astonishing grace of God"

Questions for Reflection

When you read this Gospel text, what does it tell you about the purpose of prayer? How has prayer brought you healing? How has prayer helped you to become more the beautiful human being God created you to be, more connected to God and others?

Living God, you have made this day bright the promise of your presence as you crown each moment with hope. Let your Holy Spirit pray in us now, that in all our tasks—at home, at work, at school, and in our community—we may express the joy you have in us. Be our peace in Jesus's name. Amen!

In this talk I will consider what Christian Anarchism can contribute to our understanding of our call to serve Christ in an increasingly polarized and unequal country. Even as the relatively extremist positions espoused by Leo Tolstoy in the classic Christian Anarchist tract, *The Kingdom of God is within You*, may seem impractical and idealistic, I show that Tolstoy's writings, as well as the life's work of Christian Anarchists like social activist Dorothy Day are relevant to us today in that they remind us to put Christ above the Culture, to turn towards the Gospel and away from the automatic reflexes of the right-left divide.


Choir Practice
