Pastor's Word



Luke 17:11-19

¹¹On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, ¹³they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" ¹⁴When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. ¹⁵Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? ¹⁸Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

Our Gospel from Sunday is a tale of healing, on many levels. There is the physical healing of the bodies of the men with leprosy. They are made clean. And then, as there always is in one way or another, there is the restoration to community that Jesus brings alongside the physical healing. The men are sent to the priests, because the priests can lift the order that made the men outcasts, forcing them to keep distance and call "unclean" to warn others away. The priests can open the door for the men to be part of community again. And the one who returned to thank Jesus, being a foreigner, feels this restoration more profoundly than the rest. He has the experience of being an outcast, of being invisible, not only because of his illness, but because he is "not one of us." He is inherently "other." The healing Jesus provides touches the skin, but goes much deeper than that, and brings healing to the soul and community as well.

Questions for Reflection

- 1. Have you asked for physical healing in your life? Did that healing come, as you hoped for? What was the experience of needing physical healing like?
- 2. Have you ever felt alone and cast out, and needed restoration to community? Did that restoration come, as you hoped for? What was the experience of needing restoration to community like?
- 3. What healing or restoration are you grateful for today? What healing or restoration do you ask for today?

In this talk I will consider what Christian Anarchism can contribute to our understanding of our call to serve Christ in an increasingly polarized and unequal country. Even as the relatively extremist positions espoused by Leo Tolstoy in the classic Christian Anarchist tract, *The Kingdom of God is within You*, may seem impractical and idealistic, I show that Tolstoy's writings, as well as the life's work of Christian Anarchists like social activist Dorothy Day are relevant to us today in that they remind us to put Christ above the Culture, to turn towards the Gospel and away from the automatic reflexes of the right-left divide.

Join us every Wednesday for Choir practice at 7:30pm in the Sanctuary! Contact Diane Drollinger if interested in joining the Choir.








Women's Group
