

PASTOR'S WORD

The Christ Lutheran group reading "Stand Your Ground" by Kelly Brown Douglas delved this week into Douglas' description of God as freedom. Douglas says that for those brought here from Africa to be enslaved, their understanding and experience of God as free, and their belief that God created people to be free, empowered them to resist the idea that they were meant to live in chains. Douglas describes the capacity of black people to claim freedom and wholeness in the face of chattel slavery and ongoing violence of racism as an un-shattered faith that comes from finding their identity as a people in a God of freedom (pgs 166-170). She identifies five core things that define identity in God.

Strength to persist in doing what is right, just, and kind
Thoughtfulness, commitment to supporting others in living into who God called them to be
Awareness of the life-giving force of God all around us, resisting anything that destroys life
Being true to ourselves, embracing our full humanity as children of God
Living into the truth of God's freedom

Do any of these things resonate with you? What does it mean to you to be a child of God?



People of Faith Seeking Change for Justice and Community in Webster Groves

Every Friday evening, people of faith from several neighboring churches are standing vigil for half an hour on Lockwood, all of us claiming that racism and white supremacy in our communities cannot continue. I plan to be there each week and hope you can join me.

This Friday, September 25, there will be a special event, a community discussion, starting at 5:30pm, on how regular people can step up and find their place in influencing further change. The topics that will be addressed are:

- <u>White Work</u>- *Speaker: Mimi Shipp, Emmanuel Episcopal Church.* Explain white privilege, and why it is important to enroll in a deeper understanding such as through rigorous continued education (reading/classes/seminars... and communication).
- <u>Our Schools</u>- *Speaker: Ezra Park, WGHS student.* Present WGSD efforts following Ivory Crockett Park event. Explain next actions people can take to improve WGSD.

Speaker: Webster University. Describe importance of the role of a Director of Diversity and Inclusion.

- <u>Civic Duty</u>- *Speaker: City Council member Pam Bliss.* Describe what the city is doing related to improving equity. Identify meetings to attend and provide supportive public comment (such as meetings with developers). Identify initiatives and other ways the city can be more inclusive through meetings and public comment that readily exist.
- <u>Voting</u>- *Speaker: TBD*. Importance of voting, and voting based on values. What needs to be done to 'Get Out the Vote' in the next two months in and beyond Webster Groves.
- <u>Activism</u>- *Speaker: TBD.* Discuss Black Power Blueprint (political/economic activism) and encouraging self-reliance in North St. Louis.

Speaker: Rev. Darryl Gray. Describe what specific actions have brought impact with Expect US. Relate Webster to wider issues across the Delmar Divide.

After the discussion, approximately at 6:30 pm, attendees will find a place along Lockwood and silently kneel for 8 minutes and 46 seconds. Afterwards, people stand up and hold signs along the street for 20 minutes. CDC guidelines will be followed. Please wear a mask and practice social distancing.


