

PASTOR'S WORD



Taken from the Central State Synod Council Visioning reflection: December – Giving and Generosity

Luke 21:1-4¹He looked up and saw rich people putting their gifts into the treasury; ²he also saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. ³He said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them; ⁴for all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in all she had to live on."

2 Corinthians 9:5-15 ⁵So I thought it necessary to urge the brothers to go on ahead to you, and arrange in advance for this bountiful gift that you have promised, so that it may be ready as a voluntary gift and not as an extortion.

⁶The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. ⁹As it is written, "He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures forever." ¹⁰He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. ¹¹You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; ¹²for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. ¹³Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, ¹⁴while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you. ¹⁵Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!

Allow some silence to reflect on the text and then discuss the following questions:

1. In what ways has your congregation been generous and given in the in the past?

2. In what ways has the pandemic and focus on racial justice in our country changed how you view and provide opportunities for giving?

3. How might God be calling us to be generous in the future?

Close with the following prayer:

God of abundance, you have poured out a large measure of earthly blessings: our table is richly furnished, our cup overflows, and we live in safety and security. Teach us to set our hearts on you and not these material blessings. Keep us from becoming captivated by prosperity, and grant us in wisdom to use your blessings to your glory and to the service of humankind; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Following Mary and Joseph's Journey of Hope



Matthew 2:1-5

2 In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.

Advent Journal Reflection

Mary and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem for the census, because Joseph was descended from David, and that is where David was from. It was Joseph's homeland, even if he had never been there. **Reflect on this in the red Advent Journal**.....

What place do you consider to be your homeland? Why?

When you visit this place, or think about visiting it, what comes to mind? What emotions rise in you?

Given that Joseph and Mary had likely never been to Bethlehem, how do you think they experienced this journey?

Children's Activities

In the red Advent Journal, draw a picture of your home. What is your favorite part of your home? Who lives there with you?


