

Christian Service




Women's Group

Adult Forum

April 11 Kim Shave, executive director of Humanitri, will bring us up to date on the agencies work to provide affordable housing.

On March 21 the Rev. Fred Niedner, Senior Research Professor of Religion at Valparaiso University, gave us an overview comparing the Passion Narratives of the four Gospels. He summarized by saying that each writer addressed issues that his readers were dealing with.

Mark wrote to Christians, most likely in Rome, dealing with the persecutions during Nero's reign. He wrote how Jesus' ministry and crucifixion was a model and an inspiration to sustain them during the trials of the time.


Matthew wrote to a Christian community working to come together despite different backgrounds. He emphasized forgiveness.

Luke addressed Christians that had authority over others so his telling is a guide to Christians in leadership roles.

John, the last of the canonical Gospels, was written at the end of the first century. At that point the Roman Emperor, Domitian, had outlawed Christianity. He wrote to assure the community that God was still in control.

As we journey through this Lenten season and into Holy Week, we hear again the story of Jesus' passion and crucifixion. To engage the depth of this powerful story, you are invited to this journey of the Stations of the Cross throughout the St. Louis area. This experience will make connections between Jesus' story and our own experiences in this particular time and place. There are eight stations, beginning in the heart of St. Louis City and expanding outward through the county. You can download the

If you can remove the labels from the prescription bottles that will assist in preparing them and also ensure privacy about any medications prescribed for individuals. There is a basket in the fellowship hall to place the bottles in, or we will have a set day closer to April to request the bottles to be brought to church.
