Pastor's Word



This spring feels quite different from last spring. Have you felt it? Last year this time, we were at the beginning of an out-of-control pandemic that we barely understood. We were wiping down groceries, changing clothing after being in public spaces, forgoing haircuts and medical appointments, car and home repair, washing our hands after touching the mail. We chose not to distribute palms because of concern that the virus might be passed that way, and I presided at Worship from home for several months. Families went without seeing one another, trips were cancelled, graduations moved quickly online. Work and school from home became the new norm for many, causing families to rearrange their homes and technology to accommodate multiple desk spaces. And others continued working in person throughout this last year, doing what they could to mitigate the risks and challenges for themselves and family members.

This spring, as our garden is blooming, access to vaccines and a decrease in cases has changed things dramatically. Schools are resuming in-person classes, and families are reuniting with great joy and jubilation. Continued mask-wearing has replaced wiping down groceries and supplies. I resumed presiding in the sanctuary some months ago, and have been happily visiting people in homes and outdoor coffee shops in recent weeks. We celebrated Palm Sunday online, but WITH palms this year, about 20 of us gathered for a procession on Lockwood to remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and another 20 of us gathered in the church yard on Holy Saturday to tell Old Testament stories of God's promise joined by another 5 who participated on Zoom. Things are changing!

And in just a month, on Pentecost Sunday, we will gather in our church yard to have our first in-person Worship service since March 15, 2020. Our technology team is working hard to set up a new system in our sanctuary that will allow us to easily invite people into the sanctuary for Worship while still remaining completely accessible online. Our next steps forward are yet to be decided, but it is clear, things are changing! We are moving into a new way of being church that is still forming, unfolding before us.

And through it all, God in Christ has been with us, bringing us hope and new life as surely as the vine brings hope and life to the branches. It has not always felt that way, has it? And yet, God has been at work, leading us steadily forward on unknown paths.

As we begin to slowly navigate these transitions, we can expect that it will not always feel comfortable or smooth. All of us will have different feelings, reactions, and choices to make in the months to come. The most important thing to keep in mind: a hallmark value of our return to in-person gathering will be mutual respect for the choices, vulnerabilities, and concerns of the community and its members. If it is right for you and your household to join us in person, we are thrilled to have you! There are many reasons why joining us in person may not be comfortable, wise, or possible, and for that reason we will always have an option for you to join us on Zoom. AND we are thrilled to have you!

As disconnected as we may have felt this last year, Christ the vine has been feeding us. Pentecost is coming, and the Spirit is alive! She is inspiring and guiding us, as she has all along the way.

How have you seen God at work in this last year? What losses are your grieving? (There have been so many, haven't there?) And, what gifts do you notice emerging out of this time?



- Spaces for households will be clearly designated, allowing for different size households, and for space between each household for social distancing.
- Masks are required, except when reading for the service.
- Please arrive by 9:15 if at all possible, to allow for time to find a space and settle in.
- Please bring a blanket or towel or chairs to sit on, and if that is a challenge, please just let an usher know when you arrive that you need a chair and they can provide one for you.
- We will celebrate communion! Each person/household is invited to bring their own communion for the service, but if you arrive without just let an usher know and they can provide bread and wine for you.
- We will have music, of course, and invite you to sing loudly and boldly in your heart and spirit, but refrain from singing aloud.
- Bathrooms will be available as single-use spaces, and ushers will help you know when there is a bathroom available for you and your household.

Reflect in these days leading up to Pentecost on how you have seen God at work in the last year, the losses you are grieving, and the gifts you see emerging from this time of exile. The Spirit has been with us all through the journey, and we celebrate her presence especially on Pentecost!


Upcoming Fellowship Events

May 16 *L'Arche*—representatives of L'Arche, a community of people with and without intellectual disabilities, will tell us about the organization. L'Arche leases space in the Mead Center.

May 23 *Me & White Supremacy*—The racism study group will share its most recent work and lead a discussion.

June 6 *Webster-Rock Hill Ministries*—New interim director, Derek Bastian, will bring us up to date on the organization's mission and programs.

On April 25, the *Creation Care Team*, in recognition of Earth Day last week, explained its mission. The team, lead by Alena Horn, is beginning again after the COVID hiatus. Alena explained five functions:

- Property—remove invasive species, install native plants and landscape for water conservation
- Building—advocate for energy saving features as we renovate
- Resources—provide information and help for recycling
- Culture—move to reuse more
- Education—provide "green tips".

Most of the questions and discussion were about recycling and the message was clear: recycling is necessary and good; reuse is better. The team recommended the Missouri Botanical Garden Website as the best guide to what can be recycled.

Joan O'Brien pointed out that we are recyling the "Beignet Done That" styrofoam cups. In 2004 a truck load of the cups, destine for the landfill was donated to us instead. Since styrofoam food containers can not be recycled, our use of them before they are thrown away is the responsible thing.


