

PASTOR'S WORD

There is so much change happening these days, isn't there? Reuniting with family, end of school year, travel that hasn't been possible for a long time, trees full of green as the famous Missouri humidity begins to make itself known. The waning of the pandemic and the gift of the vaccine have opened up so many more options. The other day we went out and ran several errands at brick-and-mortar stores, something we have chosen not to do for a while, and I found myself thinking about how strange it felt to do something so ordinary! I have been reminded many times lately how important it will be for all of us to be gentle, and take care of ourselves and our families as we navigate these old-new waters.

Self-care can sound the opposite of Christianity, but when we look at our scriptures, there are many examples of self-care, and God-care, to be found there. And many of those examples are some of my favorite ways to take care of myself!

When Elijah is exhausted, full-up with trauma, and completely out of options, he finds his way to a secluded spot. (Remember, Jesus himself goes off alone to pray many times!) An angel from God appears, and gives him good counsel. Sleep. Eat. Sleep. Eat. And once that is done, and Elijah has regained some energy, God tells him to listen and watch for God. And then, God listens to him, and offers him help for his road forward—Elisha as a partner in ministry.

The disciples on the road to Emmaus have a very similar experience, as Jesus shows up for them, and listens to them--so many times in scriptures, God invites people to tell them things they already know, understanding that we need to share our burdens. Then, Jesus shares a perspective with the disciples that they couldn't see for themselves, and finally feeds them.

Perhaps this can be our guide in the days to come. When you are exhausted, anxious, not sure what to do next, confused by the decisions that need to be made, or just finding yourself in need of some respite, take care of yourself! Find a quiet place to be with yourself and God for a while. Write or speak or sing what is swirling inside you, giving it over to God. Find a person you can trust, and share with them. Listen to what's on your mind, and listen well to others, as they may offer a perspective you don't have for yourself. Eat. Sleep. Pray. Ask for help.

Above all, rest in that eternal promise of scripture—in all things, God is with us. As Julian of Norwich prayed, "All shall be well. All shall be well. And all manner of things shall be well."

Following new recommendations by the CDC and lifting of restrictions by St. Louis City and County, the Covid and Worship Teams have decided to begin having in person worship each Sunday, limited to 20 people in the Sanctuary, beginning Sunday May 30!

Many of you have been eagerly awaiting this, and others, for many reasons, need to be thoughtful and discerning about inperson activities. For this reason, we are committed to maintaining full Zoom access for Worship.

Change is challenging, and we want to do everything we can to answer your questions and provide all the information you need. Here are some things to know as we begin this transition.

Registration will be required for in-person Worship, so that we know you are coming and can plan a space for you. Registration links will be posted for each service, both in the newsletter and e-mail, and you may also call or e-mail Lisette in the office to register. Registration for May 30 is Worship: Sunday Worship (signupgenius.com).

Please let us know if you are interested in Nursery services by making a note in the comments as you register. We cannot commit to when nursery will begin, but as soon as there is enough interest and TLC is ready to start, we will return to having nursery each week.

Spaces for households in the pews will be clearly designated, allowing for space between each household for social distancing.

- Masks are required, except when reading for the service.
- Vaccine is not required, but is encouraged for all who are able to receive it. While not everyone in our Worship gathering
 may be vaccinated, a very high number of people in the congregation have already been fully vaccinated, which makes
 gathering safer for everyone.
- Sanitizer will be available for use upon entry to the building.
- Please arrive by 9:15 if at all possible, to allow for time to find a space and settle in.
- We will celebrate communion! Each person/household is invited to bring their own communion for the service, but if you arrive without just let an usher know and they can provide bread and wine for you.
- We will have music, of course, and invite you to sing loudly and boldly in your heart and spirit, but refrain from singing aloud.
- Bathrooms will be available for one household at a time, and ushers will help you know when there is a bathroom available for you and your household.
- When Worship ends, all participants are invited to move outside for conversation.

As we transition into in-person gathering alongside Zoom gathering, there are many ways to participate! **Here are three immediate needs:**

- Our tech team needs a few more people to support Worship! We have an amazing team, and with summer vacations and maternity leaves we will need more people in our rotation. If you are skilled in Zoom or willing to learn, please reach out to Mike Wagner!
- Ushers will be needed to greet people as they arrive for Worship and ensure they have what they need.
- Key people will be needed to unlock doors, turn on the lights, check the elevator, and then make sure everything is closed up properly after Worship.

As we have mentioned before, a hallmark value of our return to in-person gathering will be mutual respect for the choices, vulnerabilities, and concerns of the community and its members. If it is right for you and your household to join us in person, we are thrilled to have you!

There are many reasons why joining us in person may not be comfortable, wise, or possible, and for that reason we will always have an option for you to join us on Zoom. AND we are thrilled to have you!


