# Worship Updates

A lot of work has happened and lot of decisions have been made this week, and the best news is . . . . . The choir will be singing in the sanctuary this week! Here is some detail about the choir's return, and more!

### CHOIR RETURNS

Mike worked with the choir to establish the best way for the choir to be heard by those on Zoom, and we are now ready to go! We were so blessed to hear the choir in Worship on June 17! They will sing about once a month in Worship this summer, and plan to resume regular schedule in the fall.

For those joining us in the sanctuary, a couple of things to know . . . . due to challenge for some choir members to get up to the choir loft, the choir will be singing on the main floor of the sanctuary. The Covid Team conferred about this move, and given that the choir is fully vaccinated, and given all of the data we have, the team has a consensus that the choir will remove masks while singing so that they can be heard well.

### COMMUNION SERVED FROM THE FRONT

We began serving communion from the front of the sanctuary on June 27! I will thoroughly wash and sanitize my hands and serve wafers to each person, and we will have individual cups for wine and grape juice. If you wish to continue to bring your own communion, please feel free to do so, but all are welcome to come forward, remove your masks to receive the sacrament, and replace your masks to return to your seats. There will be recycling bowls for you to deposit your cup as you return to your seat.

### **COMMUNITY PRECAUTIONS**

A word about masks and distancing . . . we are continuing to require wearing of masks by the congregation on Sunday at Worship. We are asking for all of us to take this small action of love and care for the community as a whole. Here is why we are asking that.

First, we as a congregation do have a high percentage of people in the congregation who have been vaccinated, which is awesome! We also have many children 11 and under in the congregation who are not yet eligible for vaccination, and congregational members who have suppressed immune systems and other concerns that put them at greater risk. Wearing a mask lets them know that we invite and welcome their presence with us.

Second, Covid Team and Worship Team have agreed that we are not requiring vaccination to be present at Worship, which means that although we have a very high percentage of vaccinated members, we are a mixed congregation on Sunday morning—there will be some present who will not be vaccinated, for many reasons. Those people are more vulnerable when we gather, and wearing a mask is an easy way to make it safer for all who gather.

Third, we know that there are variants that are causing surges in illness and hospitalizations in other areas of the state and country. Most of the variants are well-addressed by our current vaccines, which are highly safe and effective. And, in a situation where we are taking the steps of being in a larger group indoors, where some are not yet eligible for vaccine and some have complicating risk factors, where we love to SING, wearing a masks is a very simple thing we can do to make it a space that is safer for the whole community as we move forward together.

We as Christians are called to love one another, and care most especially for the most vulnerable among us. We thank you for loving and caring for one another!

Worshipping on Zoom for the last year and a half has required many hands—readers, prayer leaders, flower team, and especially our amazing technology team. All of you have made Worship in community possible! As we begin Worship in the sanctuary again, we need all of us to bring music, flowers, voices, fellowship, and unite our beloveds in-person and via Zoom together in full community. What gifts can you share in Worship?

The following list briefly describes the typical duties of worship-related volunteers under normal circumstances. However, some responsibilities are slightly different at the moment, due to covid restrictions. All new volunteers will be given instructions/training for their roles. Our goal is to have enough volunteers that a given person need only serve in a specific capacity once a month, at most. # **Key Persons**

Typically, one key person readies the church building prior to the first Sunday morning service/activity, while another closes it after the last service/activity. However, on Sundays with only one service and no Sunday School or Adult Forum, one person will usually do both. The early responsibilities include unlocking certain outer doors and inside rooms, turning on the lights in the sanctuary, hallway and fellowship hall, turning on the sound system, bringing the elevator down to ground level, and making coffee. Closing the church involves re-locking those same outer doors and inside rooms, turning off the lights and sound system, bringing the elevator back up to the sanctuary level, and emptying coffee grounds and filters from the coffee maker.

# Altar Guild

Altar Guild members typically work in pairs. They replace soiled altar linens with fresh ones, maintain the candles as needed, change out the paraments as appropriate, set up the communion ware on the altar and the communion elements in the narthex prior to the service, and wash the communion ware after the service.

## Ushers

Ushers typically work in pairs. They greet service attendees, hand out bulletins, pass the offering plates, direct the flow of attendees to the front of the church for communion, count total attendance, and tidy the pews after the service.

# Lectors

These volunteers are assigned to read one of the designated lessons and/or the psalm during the service. This can be done either via zoom or in the sanctuary.

### **Presenters**

Presenters typically work in pairs. They carry the communion elements from the narthex to the altar right after the offering is collected during the service.

# **Assisting Ministers**

An assisting minister sits with the pastor near the altar during the service. Primary responsibilities include reading prayers of intercession from the altar and assisting with communion.

# **Counters**

Counting is typically done in pairs, immediately after the last service on Sundays. It usually takes about 45 minutes. Counters are responsible for categorizing all monies from the offering plate, along with any recent checks that were mailed to the church. These include regular offerings, designated contributions (e.g., memorials, altar flowers, major renovations), payments for use of the Mead Center, etc. The totals in each category are recorded and passed to the Christ Lutheran Financial Secretary.

# Stewardship & Offerings

We continue to worship and reach out to people in different ways than we're traditionally accustomed. Staff and members are reaching out proactively to make sure everyone in our congregation is cared for, and connected, as much as possible. We are re-imagining ministry! Now more than ever, it takes all of us to make that happen.



We can continue to fund our church and the important work we're doing with a few easy clicks:



# **Vigil For Black Lives**

# Lockwood Ave, every Friday, 6:00-6:30pm

Last week we acknowledged two anniversaries: **Juneteenth**, the celebration of the message of the Emancipation Proclamation reaching the last of the people living in slavery in Galveston, TX, June 17, 1865, two and a half years after it was signed; and the **murder of 9 black people at Emmanuel Episcopal AME in Charleston** by a man who believed them to be a threat because of the color of their skin June 19, 2015, just six years ago. These two anniversaries taken together in June each year illustrate clearly that progress has been made. AND, the truth is that in many ways, racism and its impacts still rage today. 156 years after the last of the people living in chattel slavery were freed, access to voting rights is still restricted and threatened, and the well-being, safety, and lives of people of color are still at risk every day.

**Every Friday, from 6:00-6:30, congregations on Lockwood join together to stand for black lives**, in our community and beyond. We take a short half an hour each week to be visible on Lockwood with signs of solidarity with our black siblings. It is a small way for us to make it known that we stand against racism in all the ways it impacts all of us. Please join us!
