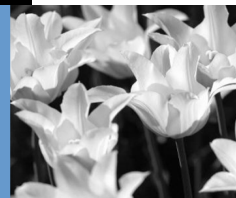

PASTOR'S WORD



Food is a central theme in the scriptures. God always seems to want to feed people.

God provides the Israelites with Manna and quail in the desert—not enough to store, but enough for the day.

When Elijah when he is exhausted, and angel comes to him where he is hiding and feeds him.

The widow thought she and her son would die from starvation because they had run out of food, but Elijah and the widow and her son find that each day they have enough oil and grain for the day.

Elisha feeds 100 people, with food left over.

Jesus tells Simon to cast the net out deeper after a whole night of catching nothing. Simon grudgingly agrees, and their nets fill to breaking.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus eats with anyone, especially those he shouldn't be eating with.

Jesus and the disciples break bread together that last night before he dies, and Jesus tells them to keep doing this in his memory.

Breaking bread and eating together has become so much a part of who Jesus is and what he does, that when Jesus breaks bread on road to Emmaus, the disciples instantly recognize him.

And in the Gospel story from John this week, Jesus sees a crowd of 5,000 people and tells his disciples to feed them. When the disciples protest that they don't have enough, a small boy with 5 loaves and 2 fishes offers what he has, and all are fed with food to spare.

Over and over, God feeds God's people. Over and over, God shows us that there will be enough. Perhaps not enough to store, but enough for the day, and enough to share.

What abundance are you grateful for today?

What do you need? What are you hungry for?

What do you have that can be shared with others today, so that God's abundance is available for all people?

Vigil For Black Lives

Lockwood Ave, every Friday, 6:00-6:30pm

Last week we acknowledged two anniversaries: **Juneteenth**, the celebration of the message of the Emancipation Proclamation reaching the last of the people living in slavery in Galveston, TX, June 17, 1865, two and a half years after it was signed; and the **murder of 9 black people at Emmanuel Episcopal AME in Charleston** by a man who believed them to be a threat because of the color of their skin June 19, 2015, just six years ago. These two anniversaries taken together in June each year illustrate clearly that progress has been made. AND, the truth is that in many ways, racism and its impacts still rage today. 156 years after the last of the people living in chattel slavery were freed, access to voting rights is still restricted and threatened, and the well-being, safety, and lives of people of color are still at risk every day.

Every Friday, from 6:00-6:30, congregations on Lockwood join together to stand for black lives, in our community and beyond. We take a short half an hour each week to be visible on Lockwood with signs of solidarity with our black siblings. It is a small way for us to make it known that we stand against racism in all the ways it impacts all of us. Please join us!

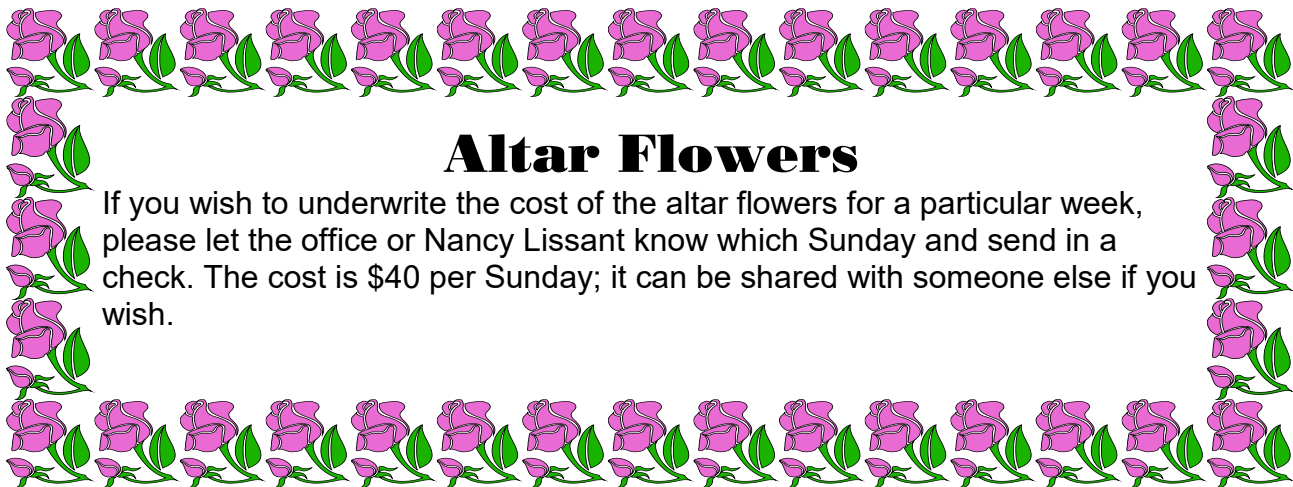
