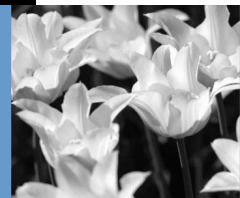

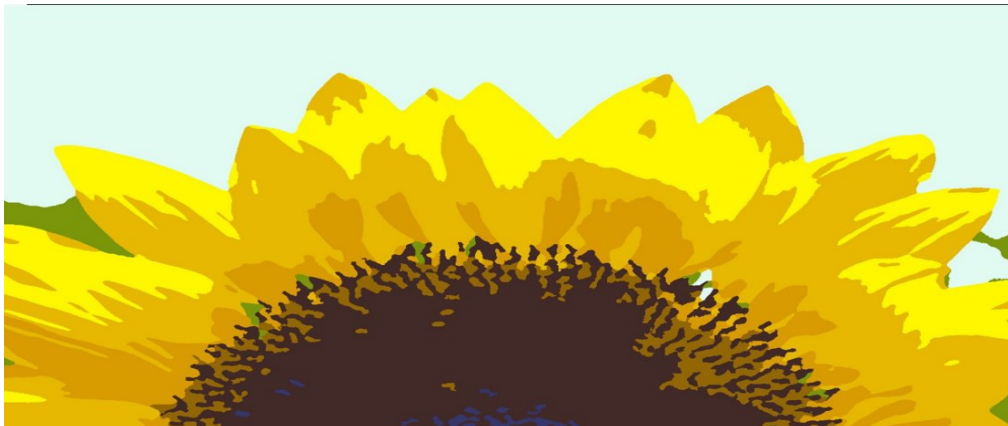

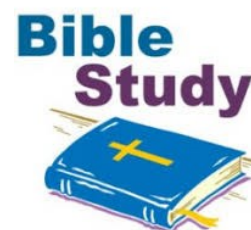
Pill Bottle Collection

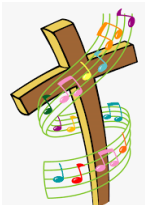
Minister alongside and provide administrative, programmatic, and spiritual support for volunteers ministering with children and youth.
