October 24 Welcome new members.

October 31 Mark Roock will interview Martin Luther, who started the Reformation in Germany during the 16th century. Dr. Luther will travel 500 years and 4500 miles to tell us what happened then and how the Reformation continues in the 21st century.

<u>November 7</u> Being Christian in Secular Society. As America becomes more secular, what can we Christians learn from the European experience? **Alena and Kersten Horn**, who have witnessed the decline of religiosity in Europe first hand, will give an overview of the phenomenon. Stasis and the State: what American Christians can learn from European secularization While Christianity booms in the Global South, it continues to decline in North America following an even starker decline in Europe. As mainline American Christians, we seek to live in a healthy pluralistic society that is neither militantly atheistic nor theocratic. How can we strike this balance? What can European history teach us in this regard? In this presentation we consider how secularization has played out in a number of European countries, including Germany, France, and Czechia. We argue that while it may have been inevitable that the birthplace of modernism experience a decline in religiosity, this decline has been accelerated at various points by the state's support of or antagonism towards organized religion.






