

UNLEASHING THE SPIRIT ON SATURDAY EVENINGS



This summer, as we were preparing for the program year, a few of us on the child education team had a meeting with Pastor Meagan. We knew it was going to be a while before kids were fully vaccinated, and we also knew (some from personal experience!) that it was almost impossible to keep kids engaged with zoom every week. And although we had some really fun fellowship-type events planned, we all felt that something was missing. We asked ourselves: how are kids worshiping? How are we, as the child education team, attending to the spiritual needs of kids and families? We decided that we needed to focus this year's Sunday School energy on attending to something other than education. What we came up with was Saturday Church.

Since early September, we have been having outdoor worship on Saturday nights at 5pm in the front lawn. The service is as "Lutheran" in order as Sunday morning, including lots of singing, a welcoming, confession and forgiveness, an alleluia verse prior to the scripture reading, a message, creed, prayer, offering, and communion. But, with input from Christ Lutheran families, we have tried to re-imagine the "what" and "how" of this liturgy. For instance, for offering, Kate Hoerchler has been asking those of us gathered to share what we have offered others by way of our selves or our time in the previous week. One week for prayer, Alena Horn has asked those of us gathered to walk in silent reflection around the church yard praying for the things and people we see. At another service, the prayers were done as we each created our own prayer labyrinth. For two of the weeks, both children and adults have been enamored with Roger Rose's storytelling. Pastor Meagan has led us in a new way of experiencing communion, not as a piece of bread and wine, but as a meal of pizza and fruit cups. That's right, we get to eat dinner together as communion, just like Jesus and the disciples. Ok, maybe not exactly like that - I doubt Jesus handed out popsicles. But, the eating of a meal together in community with others is exactly what the early church did for communion. And it is teaching us that if Christ can be found in an ordinary meal shared by friends, then Christ can be found in many other ordinary places.

It really has been a lot of fun every Saturday. And by the way, the service is not just for families. You don't even need to RSVP. Just show up. Even on a whim! The first week it absolutely poured on us, but everyone stayed for the whole service, eating communion in the back of vans and suvs. It's gotten better since then, and we're going to keep having them until it gets too cold or kids are fully vaccinated. We'll be at it again this coming Saturday. Would you join us? If so, please bring your pets for a blessing if you'd like and don't forget a blanket or lawn chairs. We will gather at 5, worship, eat, and enjoy being together.

October 24 Welcome new members

October 31 Mark Roock has landed an exclusive interview with Martin Luther, who started the Reformation in Germany during the 16th century. Dr. Luther will travel 500 years and 4500 miles to tell us what happened then and how the Reformation continues in the 21st century.

On Sunday, October 3, Dr. Philip Mudd gave us an update on the COVID-19 pandemic and answered questions. Here are some of the things he told us:

-The Pfizer vaccine is approved for booster shots at this time. The Moderna and J&J vaccines have not yet been approved for boosters.

-If you have been vaccinated and are not immuno-compromised there is a near zero chance of severe disease and death.

-The new pill developed by Merck to treat COVID sounds encouraging. However the scientific community has yet to review the research data on the medication.

-If COVID follows the pattern of previous pandemics we shouldn't see a large increase in cases this coming winter. Generally pandemics faze out after three or four surges, (we are at that point with COVID) but in the past the disease has remained present in the population. This is the situation with influenza, where, 100 years after the 1918 pandemic, we are still dealing with the disease.

-As COVID cases recede, incidence of flu, RSV, and other respiratory viruses is likely to increase.

-Get a flu shot. It's okay to get a COVID booster and another vaccine at the same time.

-If you are vaccinated and your Holiday plans include spending time with people who are unvaccinated, don't worry. You might get mild case but are protected from a severe case.

-If you plan to travel to places where COVID incidence is high and the health system is in crisis, be careful. -Long COVID occurs mostly among unvaccinated but research continues.

-Asymptotic spread of the delta virus by vaccinated people is lower than seen with the unvaccinated but it does occur.

-The Pfizer vaccine is safe and effective for Children under 12 and approval is weeks away.

-Children overall are safe from severe COVID. The serious cases that have occurred are in unvaccinated obese teenagers and kids with certain medical conditions. Healthy children under 5 are not at risk.

-Until effective vaccines are administered worldwide, the threat of a dangerous variant remains.

-Masks on the community level protect against the spread of COVID from mild and asymptotic cases.

-N95 and surgical masks are both protective and are both better that cloth masks.

-Despite predictions that more people would get vaccinated when the Pfizer vaccine received permanent authorization from the FDA, it didn't happen. The Moderna vaccine is still under emergency authorization but will be approved eventually.

-We now know COVID is primarily transmitted by droplets through the air. The virus dies quickly on surfaces so contact transmission has ceased to be a concern.

Over the past 18 months **Dr. Mudd** has headed the CLC COVID team and has generously shared his expertise and guidance with the Christ Lutheran Community. We are exceedingly grateful to him and the entire team.


Women's Group

CROP Walk 2021


