Summary of March 20th Adult Forum

How could Johann Sebastian Bach have been an influence on Ludwig von Beethoven? Bach was a Lutheran church organist and Baroque composer. While Beethoven, the renowned composer of secular music for orchestra and keyboard, led the transition from the classical music period to the romantic? Dr. Mark Ruff, Christ Lutheran's organist and a professor of History at Saint Louis University, explained the connection. He drew on historical sources and illustrated his points by playing brief selections from both composers on the piano.

Bach died twenty years before Beethoven was born in 1770 and lived in Leipzig, more than 500 km from Bonn where Beethoven grew up. What's more, Bach's music, mostly religious, was being played less by the time young Beethoven was studying. The link between the two was Christian Gottlob Neefe, who came from Leipzig to be the court organist in Bonn. He started teaching Beethoven in 1783, when the Ludwig was thirteen, and subsequently became a father figure to him. It was Neefe who introduced Beethoven to Bach's two volumes of *The Well Tempered Clavier*, a collection of Fugues and Preludes. "Neefe brought a secularized version of Bach and introduced it to thirteen year old Beethoven," Mark said.

Mark played tunes from both composers to show similarities and he also explained that Beethoven used an array of key signatures, as did Bach. Most classical composers wrote in a smaller number of keys. Next week Mark will explain how motifs and forms of Beethoven's music can be traced back to Bach.



Notice to Congregation of Congregational Vote April 3 Regarding Sale of Mead Center Sent by the Council March 21, 2022

People of Christ Lutheran Church,

On December 19, 2021, the Congregation approved the sale of #17 Selma (the Arden Mead Center) to the Webster Groves School District (WGSD) for the agreed-to contract price of \$875,000, subject to an appraisal to be ordered by WGSD. As the Congregation was informed at the December 19 meeting, because WGSD is a public buyer, the school district legally cannot purchase property above appraisal price.

That appraisal was completed in February and Christ Lutheran's real estate representative, King Realty Advisors, was notified of the results on March 4. Unfortunately, the appraisal came back at \$710,000, approximately 20% below the contract price. While our advisors and involved Council members (Larry Hill and Jess Gunther) believe that the results are fundamentally flawed based on the appraiser's scope, comments and comparables used, our attempts to seek a "second opinion" have been steadfastly rejected by the District. WGSD has presented their appraisal to the School Board for approval and the amount is on the record as final. As we were aware at the outset, WGSD has advised us that they are powerless under the law to consider alternative valuations.

The Congregation now has a choice to make. In order to bring these options to the Congregation, we have worked with the district to extend the contract term to allow us time to review our position and possible courses of action.

Option 1: Sell #17 Selma to WGSD for appraised price of \$710,000.

Considerations:

- Significantly lower sale price than original contract price
- No repairs need to be done on Christ Lutheran's part before sale
- WGSD will likely use the building primarily for administrative/office space and is a current community neighbor to the Church.
- Sale could close relatively soon

Option 2: Terminate the contract with WGSD and put the property back on the market.

Considerations:

- May be able to secure higher sale price for the building to a commercial buyer.
 - ◆King Realty Advisors' initial value amounts (Summer 2021) were as follows:
 - *\$850,000 (patient seller track)
 - *\$775,000 (moderate track)
 - *\$700,000 (fast sale track)
 - ♦ Mortgage rates are now substantially higher than those at the time the above market value estimates were made, potentially impairing values.
- Because of its unique nature, finding another buyer for the building may take time

 in upwards of a year based on King Realty Advisors estimate.
- Roof is in need of replacement (\$80,000 estimated cost) and with a new contract, we may incur this cost as part of sale.
- Additional staff and volunteer hours will be needed to coordinate maintenance and any needed repairs while we wait for sale.



- Ongoing water damage will need some remediation/cosmetic repair with possibly substantial costs before additional showings of the property to interested buyers
- Other repairs and upgrades (parking lot, bathrooms, etc.) are likely necessary to attract a commercial buyer
- Current zoning of this property is for a church, library or school. Any buyer wanting to use the building for another purpose (like office space) will need to secure a conditional use permit from the City of Webster Groves. In discussing with the city, King informs us that this seems like a viable option for most probable buyers.

Based on the circumstances and taking all details into consideration, Council has unanimously voted to recommend to the Congregation moving forward with Option #1 - to sell #17 Selma to WGSD at the appraised price of \$710,000.

March 27 and 29: We expect you may have questions! Join Council for FAQ sessions after worship in the sanctuary on Sunday March 27 and on Zoom Tuesday March 29 at 7:00 p.m. We will also make an FAQ document available to review ahead of the Congregational vote.

April 3: In order for all voices to be heard, we will hold a special Congregational vote on the sale on Sunday, April 3 in accordance with the church's constitution. We'll hold the vote in the sanctuary (and on Zoom) directly after worship.


Vigil For Black Lives
