May 22-A representative from **Humanitri**, one of CLC's chosen benevolences, will update us on its work and mission. Humanitri works with homeless families to find stable and affordable housing.

Sunday May 1, Summary

Philip Mudd, MD PhD, head of Christ Lutheran's COVID-19 task force, and Jessica Gunther, Congregational President, spoke at Adult Forum and answered questions. They addressed what lies ahead for the congregation as the risk from COVID-19 lessens.

Dr. Mudd said, "It's great to not be in masks now but things will get worse next winter, We need to take care of each other." He made three main points: 1) infections of COVID-19 are low in our area and hospitalizations are the lowest since the pandemic began; 2) vaccines work; 3) but COVID-19 is not gone for good, in fact he expects another surge next winter.

He pointed out the blood tests show that about 85 percent of the population has antibodies to the virus that causes COVID-19, either through immunization or infection. That means 10 to 15 percent are still vulnerable. These people are susceptible to becoming ill when the weather cools off next winter.

Jessica Gunther agreed that taking care of each other is part of our congregational mission and so is care for the larger community—people outside our walls. She noted we are now able to reach people at home on Sunday morning through zoom. That would not have happened without the pandemic shut down. She lauded the work with Webster-Rock Hill Ministries and the leadership of the Christian Service Committee. Now with the sale of the Mead Center and the renovation gearing up, she sees Christ Lutheran building on its work as a strong Christian presence in the community.

When asked about vaccine boosters Dr. Mudd said that data shows maximum protection is achieved with three shots (two in series and a booster) and vulnerable groups, the elderly and immunocompromised individuals, benefit from a fourth shot (second booster). But for healthy adults the fourth shot does not seem necessary. That's because although the level of circulating antibodies wanes over time, the antibody making cells remember the novel Corona virus antigen and begin making antibodies when re-exposed. For that reason, he doubts there will be a need for repeated booster shots.


Dr. Mudd is hopeful that a vaccine for preschool age children will be available soon. Young children, he said, rarely need hospitalization or die from COVID- 19 but they can hasten the spread. So a pediatric vaccine is necessary to bring the disease under control.


